Preparing for Practice:

- 13. Once you pass the board exam, upgrade to FREE Graduated Student membership at cdha.ca/studentupgrade. CDHA's Graduated Student membership category includes professional liability insurance (PLI) coverage of up to \$5 million aggregate until December 31 of the year in which you passed the board exam. (Registration for licensure in Québec includes PLI.)
- Consider other professional insurance through CDHA such as extended health, dental and disability coverage: cdha.ca/insuranceprograms
- 15. Apply for registration with your provincial regulatory body at fdhrc.ca/pages/dental-hygiene-in-canada/ provincial-regulators
 - (Investigate regulatory requirements for practising dental hygiene in the province of your choice. Other requirements such as jurisprudence and criminal record checks may apply.)
