Unfortunately, that wasn't the case. He removed both thyroid and parathyroid. But the good news is the cysts/tumors on my thyroid were further tested and everything came back benign. Although I am now without a thyroid and on medication for the rest of my life, my thyroid levels are normal and monitored and I may have avoided a cancer scare thanks to my wonderful dental hygienist Kasia, who had the knowledge to notice something not quite right and may have been the one responsible in saving my life from the lack of hormones or prolonged existence of tumors turning cancerous.
