# Nominator: Joanne Wing






# Nominator: Dr. Henry Louie

I have known Donna Lee since I started my post-graduate program in Periodontics in 1992. During this time, she was completing her dental hygiene program in Vancouver. Prior to being a dental hygienist, Donna was a certified dental assistant and a social worker. Donna has excelled in both her clinical and academic career. She has practiced in general and periodontal practices in Vancouver, as well as satellite periodontal clinics in the Yukon and northern BC. She recently completed her Bachelor of Dental Hygiene program, finishing a combined graduate program (Master of Public Health in medicine and diploma in Dental Public Health). She has also been an inspiration to her peers, recently being selected to receive the Dianne Gallagher Inspiration Award. Donna's most admirable quality, however, is her passion to improve access to health and dental care for Canada's indigenous peoples. Throughout her career, she has devoted much of her time volunteering and practicing in rural communities. It is not surprising at all Donna just recently left Vancouver to serve a one year position in Igaluit as the oral health promotion specialist for the Territory of Nunavut. In her new position, Donna is truly a trailblazer in her field. Given that the territory is only nineteen years old, there is a lack of guidelines and services in place in regards to oral health for the Inuit. Her primary responsibilities are to develop oral health promotion strategies for the Government of Nunavut, and to work closely with the Population Health team with their health promotion campaigns (including issues related to maternal and children's health, smoking cessation programs, cannabis, injury prevention, nutrition, cancer, and alcohol). Her position also involves collaborating with other stakeholders in the community such as the schools, college, and long-term care facilities with oral education and curriculum development. Donna's new domain of Nunuvat is a vast territory with 25 communities dispersed over 2 million square kilometres. She will be visiting these communities to assess their oral health needs and services. When Donna first told me she was going to Igaluit for a year, I had just heard in the news that the temperature in Iqaluit was -40 degrees Celsius! Also, due to a blizzard, some areas did not have water or sewage. Accepting the responsibility of the position she has taken in these challenging conditions takes the courage and compassion of a very special person. I proudly and sincerely nominate Donna Lee to be a Dental Hygiene Superhero.








#### Nominator: Nicole Fisher

She has been a volunteer with the Warriors Against Violence Society in Vancouver and with CAPHD's communication committee. Other presentations include CAPHD 2015 & 2016: "Dental Services at a Not-for-Profit Dental Clinic in Vancouver, BC: The Case of Public Dental Insurance" and "Exploring Access to Oral Health Among Marginalized Persons with a History of Incarceration." Ms Lee's background in Social Work has prepared her well for these opportunities she has found and created to reach all people to improve health. In addition to her community health work, she has worked with the clinical Faculty of Dentistry and Dental Hygiene at UBC for many years and is currently completing her Provincial Instructors Diploma. In addition to all of this, Ms Lee is a warm and caring person who is a pleasure to be around and learn from. She is a true Super Hero!




### Nominator: Cindy Chan

Dear Dental Hygiene Canada: When I read "dental hygiene super hero" a picture of one of my former classmates, a wonderful friend and colleague, Donna Lee, summitting Mount Kilimanjaro immediately came to mind. Donna has inspired me academically, professionally and personally throughout the 23 years that we have known each other. I met Donna in 1994, at our VCC Dental Hygiene School entrance interview and was immediately impressed by her professionalism. On the first day of class I was not at all surprised to see that she had been a successful applicant for the program. As classmates in the 2 year diploma program, I came to know Donna personally and academically. She was a conscientious student, a perfectionist in every way and took her studies seriously. Although she has a quiet demeanour previous experience in dentistry, made her a natural leader. Donna leads by example and inspired the other students, including myself to self- evaluate and ask how we can excel whether it is for exams, projects, or clinical evaluations. Her tireless effort and hard work helped Donna win several awards including the BCDHA "Student Table Clinic Award" and the "Clinical Scholarship Award". After graduation, I've had the pleasure to work with Donna in general dentistry. She is always willing to share her experience and knowledge in periodontal practice and is also a constant resource of advice and knowledge in patient care especially in instrumentation. As a mentor to me she shares stories of the experiences and challenges she faced in periodontal practice. She took pride in the high standard of patient care she gave to each and every client who sat in her chair and beamed when she spoke of the healing and resolution of gingival tissue after initial therapy. My own professional philosophy, that every dental hygienist should practice as they would in a periodontal practice, was inspired by Donna. Donna completed the Bachelor of Dental Science degree in Dental Hygiene in 2014 but she has always had an inquiring mind, and to give up the security of private practice to pursue a combined Master of Public Health and Dental Public Health Specialty degree at UBC further inspired awe in me. Having known Donna for over 20 years, this path she took was one of the most challenging in her lifetime so far. There were many sleepless nights, stress, struggles and self -doubt (she was a proficient self- evaluator) as she juggled roles as a master student, clinical instructor and lecturer at the UBC DMD and Dental Hygiene programs. She persevered through adversity and earned the Dr. James Rossiter Public Health Practicum Award in 2016 (recognition of excellence of public health policy makers and practitioners) to become the first and only graduate in 2017 of the dual master program. The sacrifices Donna selflessly has made to contribute to public health by helping marginalized people in







the community obtain oral care and for the profession of dental hygiene, is truly what makes her a super hero. While working up north during her studies. Donna developed an interest in working with the Indigenous population. Amongst her numerous volunteer activities she is also an oral health educator at an indigenous support group and dental hygienist at the Vancouver Native Society. Her public health vision is for increase access to health and oral care for native people. She has research publications in progress and her goal is to make oral health care accessible to everyone. Not only was Donna an inspiration to me professionally she was also an inspiration to me on a personal level. When Donna started running marathons in 1996, I watched in admiration of the level of fitness she was achieving and envied the amount of calories she was able to consume. What I couldn't empathize with was the mental and physical struggle that accompanies marathon training and the race itself. To be honest, I thought she was crazy. Until one day I thought, maybe I can train for a marathon and I took up running. By then she had run multiple marathons. She was very supportive during my training, giving me strategic advice, hand me down running clothes and she even came out to watch me on race day despite having recent major surgery. Marathon training is mentally and physically vigorous and builds character as I have discovered. Something that I thought I could not and would not ever do in my lifetime. But Donna inspired me to take the challenge and just as she inspired one of my professional philosophies (noted above) Donna gave me my running philosophy, do it now when you can because one day you may not be able to. Donna has and will continue to inspire me and many dental hygienists on many different levels. She is definitely a superhero in dental hygiene and public health.
