#### More Details on the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB)

The federal government has updated their webpage on CERB. Good news! Members were questioning whether they could earn a small income while on CERB. The government previously did not allow this, but due to advocacy efforts, have now announced that you can make up to \$1,000/month and not jeopardize your CERB.

When submitting your first claim, you cannot have earned more than \$1,000 in employment and/or self-employment income for 14 or more consecutive days within the four-week benefit period of your claim.

When submitting subsequent claims, you cannot have earned more than \$1,000 in employment and/or self-employment income for the entire four-week benefit period of your new claim.

#### **Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA)**

While we were pleased to see the federal government's economic measures for small businesses in the COVID-19 Economic Response Plan with interestfree loans, CDHA wrote to the Ministers of Finance and Small Business to express our concerns with some of the eligibility criteria for CEBA as it currently stands. We highlighted that many dental hygienists who own and operate their own business may not be eligible because they are sole proprietors or have not paid between \$50,000 to \$1 million in total payroll in 2019. We asked that

the government expand the requirements of the Canada Emergency Business Account so that sole proprietor businesses and those with a lower payroll may access these essential loans. This week the government expanded the CEBA and are now allowing companies who spent between \$20,000 to \$1.5 million in total payroll in 2019 to be eligible. Although this does not address sole proprietors, it will allow more of our independent dental hygienists to receive financial support.
