COVID-19 vaccine information

Health Canada's recently updated <u>Vaccines for COVID-19</u> page provides information on each of the approved vaccines, the approval process as well as reported side effects following COVID-19 vaccination in Canada. Health Canada has released a <u>statement</u> confirming that the health benefits of the AstraZeneca vaccine outweigh the risks.

NACI extends dose interval for COVID-19 vaccine

The National Advisory Committee on Immunization, in the context of limited COVID-19 supply of vaccines, is recommending that jurisdictions maximize the number of individuals benefiting from the first dose of vaccine by extending the interval for the second dose of vaccine up to four months. Reporting Adverse Events Following Immunization (AEFI) in Canada

The Public Health Agency of Canada collects reports of adverse events following immunizations from provincial and territorial health departments, health care professionals and the pharmaceutical industry. The collected <u>data</u> is used to identify any adverse events that may possibly require a more in-depth investigation. To report an adverse reaction, complete the <u>Adverse Events</u> following Immunization (AEFI) Form and send it to your local Health Unit.

Evidence the UK variant is more deadly

The British Medical Journal published <u>new findings</u> showing that the UK variant is not only more infectious but also potentially more deadly.

Pregnancy, COVID-19 and the vaccine
